Bureau van Dijk's MintGlobal: 40 Million Companies and Counting

- **Search** for companies by name, ticker, or any combination of screening criteria, including industry, location, ownership, auditor, number of employees, finances, market cap, incorporation date, and dozens more.
- **Access** information including descriptive overviews and histories, news, Datamonitor company reports, peer comparisons, financial data, ratios, stock data, shareholders, subsidiaries, directors, contact information, and more.
- **Download** your results list or the full reports of any number of companies.
- **Note:** You must enable pop-ups in your internet browser to use MintGlobal.



The Other Modules

- **News:** Company-related news from Reuters, Financial Times, Dow Jones, and Zephyr (mergers and acquisitions news). These feeds are also incorporated into the Companies module. Be aware that the library provides more comprehensive newspaper databases: Factiva and LexisNexis.
- **Market Research:** Industry reports with a global or national focus published by Datamonitor. These are also linked from the Companies module. Other good library databases for industry reports include S&P NetAdvantage, Value Line, Mintel, Global Market Information Database, and MarketResearch.com.
- **Original Documents:** Scanned images of companies' annual reports, SEC filings, and other official reports. Availability stretches back ten years in most cases.

Advanced Access

- **Orbis:** Mint is the user-friendly interface to Bureau van Dijk's Orbis database. We also have access to the original Orbis interface, which can be found on the Databases A-Z page or through the Find a Database tool. The Orbis interface has some functionality that Mint lacks.
- **WRDS:** Portions of Orbis will soon be made available on the WRDS platform. These subsets of Orbis include: Osiris (publicly traded companies worldwide), Amadeus (European companies), and Oriana (Asia/Pacific companies).
