The latest addition to BYU's collection for industry research, this user-friendly database contains in-depth reports on **over 800 U.S. and Chinese industries**, from soybean farming to video games.

Reports can be exported as PDFs and most are updated quarterly.

More Industry Overviews

- **Gartner:** News, reports, and analysis in hi-tech industries.
- **S&P's NetAdvantage:** Click on the Industry tab at the top then use the drop-downs to select an industry or sub-industry survey. Only broad industry categories are covered, but these reports are great sources for trends and comparative statistics.
- **Value Line:** Click on Plus Edition and search for your industry or company.
- **Business Source Premier:** The Enhanced Business Searching interface makes it easy to find Datamonitor's brief Industry or Company profiles, with SWOT analyses.
- **Mint Global:** Also has some Datamonitor profiles.

BizMiner

Average financial statements for an industry, monthly cash flow statements and failure rates for start-ups. For example:

- Nationwide the restaurant industry's gross margin is 59% of revenue, but net profit is only 5.5%
- The asset turnover ratio is 1.4 and the quick ratio is 0.5
- Provo-Orem area restaurants record sales of about \$30,000 per employee
- And what is the failure rate for restaurants in the Provo-Orem area? 37%

RMA eStatement Studies

The Financial Ratio Benchmarks Data (FRB) provides common-sized fundamentals and norms for industries, including liquidity, coverage, leverage, and operating ratios.

The Industry Default Probability Data (IDP) uses cash flow measures and Moody's KMV's RiskCalc to project the Expected Default Frequency (EDF) for an industry.

This data stretches back six years and can be examined on a national or regional basis. It is also broken up by the size of firms within an industry, and everything can be exported to Excel.

Company Databases

- **Mint Global:** Profiles for 50 million companies worldwide. Search by a wide variety of criteria. Construct lists and export to Excel.
- **LexisNexis:** Similar to Mint Global.
- **Factiva** is the best place for business news and also has profiles for public companies
- **S&P NetAdvantage, Value Line** and **Morningstar** all have investment reports on companies
- **Business Source Premier (EBSCO)** has brief company profiles from Datamonitor

Market Research

- **Global Market Information Database (GMID):** Macroeconomic and demographic statistics together with consumer trends and market reports. International focus.
- **Mintel:** High quality, in-depth reports covering consumer goods, travel, lifestyles, food, financial services, and demographic segments. Focus on the US and Western Europe.
- **MarketResearch.com Academic:** Reports from a handful of publishers covering consumer goods, food, pharmaceuticals, biotech, chemicals, and demographic segments. Focus on the US.
- **eMarketer:** Statistics, trends and analysis on internet and digital marketing and media.

News and Trade Publications

- **Business and Industry (RDS)-Gale:** Over 900 trade publications.
- **ABI/Inform (ProQuest):** Trade publications and newspapers.
- **LexisNexis:** Newspapers.
- **Factiva (Dow Jones):** Best source for local and international business newspapers. Use the drill-down filters to narrow your search to specific industries or companies.

Industry and Trade Associations

Trade associations can be a great source of information. Depending on the association they might have data available on their website, or contacting them might result in good leads. A search in Google is often effective in identifying and locating associations. You might also try ASAE's Gateway to Associations Directory: <http://www.asaecenter.org/Directories/AssociationSearch.cfm>

Government Resources

- **Census Bureau** (<http://www.census.gov/>): Not just demographics. The Economic Census runs every five years and counts establishments by industry and their receipts.
- **Bureau of Economic Analysis** (<http://www.bea.gov/>): GDP and industry input-output data.
- **Bureau of Labor Statistics** (<http://www.bls.gov/ppi/>): The Producer Price Index measures changes over time in the prices received by American firms for their products.
